

Your Rights

Parents have a right to:

- Request information about the qualifications of their child's classroom teachers and paraprofessionals
- Be notified if their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not state certified or licensed
- Request regular meetings to offer suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their child
- Be provided with an individual student report about the performance of their child on the state assessments in reading, language arts, and mathematics
- Be involved in the development of the Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP)
- Be involved in decisions about parent and family engagement funds are spent

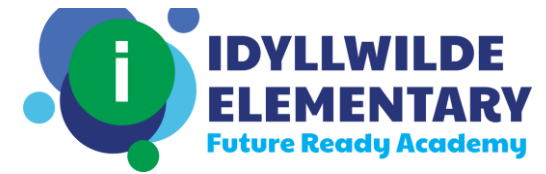
